


**A brief summary of how the Disciples of Jesus died? Other Disciples too...**

	<p><u><b>Andrew</b></u> Was crucified on an X-shaped cross in Patras, Greece <b>which he</b> saluted and stated: 'I have long desired and expected this happy hour. The cross has been consecrated by the body of Christ.'</p>		<p><u><b>Bartholomew</b></u> He was a missionary to Asia ..and witnessed for our Lord in present day Turkey .. Bartholomew was martyred for his preaching in Armenia where he was flayed to death by a whip.</p>
	<p><u><b>James</b></u> The leader of the church in Jerusalem, was thrown over the pinnacle of the Temple when he refused to deny his faith in Christ. When they discovered that he survived the fall, his enemies beat James to death with a fuller's club.</p>		<p><u><b>James the Great</b></u> James was beheaded at Jerusalem. A Roman officer walked beside James to the place of execution. Overcome by conviction, he declared his new faith and knelt beside James to be beheaded as a Christian</p>
	<p><u><b>John</b></u> Faced martyrdom when he was boiled in a huge basin of boiling oil during a wave of persecution in Rome, however, He died as an old man, the only apostle to die peacefully</p>		<p><u><b>Judas</b></u> When the high priests ignored his plea, he threw down the <b>30 pieces</b> of silver that he had been paid, and went off and hanged himself.</p>
	<p><u><b>Jude</b></u> According to several stories, he was crucified at Edessa (the name of cities in both Turkey and Greece) in 72 AD.</p>		<p><u><b>Matthew</b></u> A tax collector and writer of a Gospel, ministered in Persia and Ethiopia. Some of the oldest reports say he was not martyred, while others say he was stabbed to death in Ethiopia.</p>



Peter

He was crucified upside down on x-shaped cross. According to church tradition, it was because he told his tormentors that he felt unworthy to die in the same way that Jesus Christ had died.



Philip

First of Jesus' disciples, became a missionary in Asia. Eventually, he traveled to the Egyptian city of Heliopolis, where he was scourged, thrown into prison, and crucified in 54 AD.



Simon

AKA the Zealot: Simon preached in Mauritania on the west coast of Africa, and then went to England, where he was crucified in 74 AD.



Thomas

Thomas preached the gospel in Greece and India, where he angered local religious authorities, who martyred him by running him through with a spear.

*And ye shall be hated of all men for my Name's sake:  
But he that endureth to the end shall be saved!

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake  
of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of  
heaven."*




Paul

Was tortured & beheaded. Paul endured a lengthy imprisonment, *allowing him to write many epistles which taught many of the basic doctrines of Christianity,*



Mark

Died in Alexandria, Egypt, after being dragged by horses through the streets until he was dead.



Luke

On this day, St. Luke the Evangelist and physician, was martyred by hanging.. He was one of the many disciples mentioned in the tenth chapter of his gospel..



Matthias

The apostle chosen to replace the traitor **Judas Iscariot**, was stoned and then beheaded.
